

YUGOSLAVIA – JUGOSLAVIJA

COAT OF ARMS

Yugoslavia, known prior to 1929 as The Kingdom of the Serbs, Croats and Slovenes, emerged in 1918 when the Kingdoms of Serbia and Montenegro united with Bosnia and Herzegovina, Croatia, Slovenia and other Austro-Hungarian provinces. Several of these countries issued their own stamps during World War II when Yugoslavia was dismembered. Yugoslavia became a Federal People's Republic in 1946 and gained control of a part of the Free Territory of Trieste.

Yugoslavia has an area of about 99,000 sq. mi. and a population of about 17,000,000 (1953). Capital: Belgrade (about 400,000). Chief exports: wood, corn, copper, wheat, fruits and tobacco. Currency: 100 Para = 1 Dinar.
